Summer Stories is all about embracing the power of storytelling, especially for those whose voices are often silenced. Throughout the summer, we explored different art forms like writing, collage, and comics, with an emphasis on each student's agency to share their experiences—whether lighthearted or heavy. We had everything from oil pastels to sticker machines, creating space to experiment and express ourselves!

But it wasn't just about the art. Social justice and community organizing were laced into everything we did. From daily invocations rooted in the words of powerful organizers to workshops that pushed us to think deeper about our world, we connected our stories to the bigger picture. And of course, we bonded over amazing food, supporting local BIPOC businesses and centering around the idea that food is a powerful glue across cultures, connecting us to one another and what matters most. FEEST trains youth of color and working-class youth to build collective power and organize for transformative and systemic change in their schools.

Our power comes from building a strong base, developing youth leaders, and running dynamic, radically joyful campaigns for systemic material change. Our work is both youth-led and multigenerational.


DAILY INVOCATION:

"We are in an imagination battle.

Trayvon Martin and Mike Brown and Renisha McBride and so many others are dead because, in some white imagination, they were dangerous. And that imagination is so respected that those who kill, based on an imagined, radicalized fear of Black people, are rarely held accountable.

Imagination has people thinking they can go from being poor to a millionaire as part of a shared American dream. Imagination turns Brown bombers into terrorists and white bombers into mentally ill victims. Imagination gives us borders, gives us superiority, gives us race as an indicator of ability. I often feel I am trapped inside someone else's capability. I often feel I am trapped inside someone' else's imagination, and I must engage my own imagination in order to break free."

The Tree of Oppression is a visual tool that helps people understand the deeper, systemic causes of issues like racism, or inequality.

It shows how surface-level problems ("leafs") are connected to institutions ("trunk") and rooted in systems of oppression like White Supremacy or capitalism. By addressing these root causes, we can work toward real, lasting change rather than just temporary solutions.
